

The Lord's Supper: The Memorial to Christ

Passover Feast

- Lamb, one year old male, was slain and eaten. Ex. 12:5-10



The blood was put on the lintel and sides of the door of the house. Ex. 12:22-23

- When God saw the blood He would pass over that house. Ex. 12:13
- They remembered God's deliverance. Ex. 12:17

REMEMBRANCE

Bread ... Body

Cup ... Blood

Our association with Jesus' death

Matthew 26:26-28

- Bread - “Take, eat; this is my body”
- Fruit of the vine - “Drink ye all of it; for this is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for many for the remission of sins”

PROCLAMATION

“shew” = proclaim, show forth

The Lord's death

Matthew 26:29

“But I say unto you, I will not drink henceforth of this fruit of the vine, until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father’s kingdom”

- New - new purpose I Corinthians 11:26
“...shew the Lord’s death till he come”
- “with you” Communion or Fellowship
I Corinthians 10:16-17
- Kingdom - Church Matthew 16:13-19
